

# Trekking in the Karakoram

Pakistan: K2, Snow Lake, Gondogoro La and Nanga Parbat

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The Karakoram in northern Pakistan is home to many of the world's highest mountains, including K2, Broad Peak, Gasherbrum I and Gasherbrum II. This guide describes three of the most popular high-altitude treks in the Karakoram: Snow Lake and the Biafo and Hispar Glaciers; the K2 Base Camp Trek; and Gondogoro La via Concordia. Also included are two shorter treks in the shadow of another 8000m peak, nearby Nanga Parbat: Fairy Meadows and Rakhiot Base Camp Trek; and a trek to Diamir Face. The longer treks take around 11-12 days, although it is wise to include additional days for rest and acclimatisation.

Written by an experienced trekking guide and expert on the Karakoram, the book offers a wealth of advice on preparing for a trek and what to expect while in Pakistan, with sections on trek operators, cost, transport, food and drink, equipment and safety. Day by day route description is accompanied by mapping and inspirational photography, and you'll also find fascinating background notes on Pakistan's people, culture, geology, plants and wildlife, and the history of climbing and exploration in the Karakoram. Packed with information, the guide will enhance any visit to the mountains of the Gilgit-Baltistan region.
