

The West Highland Way

Scottish Great Trail – Milngavie (Glasgow) to Fort William

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A guidebook to walking the West Highland Way, a 156km (96 mile) route between Milngavie and Fort William. This Scottish Long Distance Route can be walked in 1 week and is suitable for walkers with some long distance walking experience.

- Presented in 7 stages of 14-33km (9-20 miles)
- The guidebook comes with a separate map booklet of 1:25,000 OS maps showing the full route. Clear step-by-step route descriptions link together with the map booklet at each stage along the way
- Route is described south-north
- Route passes through Drymen, Crianlarich, Tyndrum, Kinlochleven, Bridge of Orchy
- Local points of interest include Loch Lomond, Rannoch Moor, Glen Coe, Ben Nevis
- The book features a trek planner that highlights information about accommodation, facilities and public transport along the route
